

TOWN ORDINANCES

Residents are reminded that there are general guidelines regulating activities within a community. All Town Ordinances/Regulations, in their entirety, are available for review at the Town Office. Brief summaries of often questioned regulations are as follows:

- Dogs may not run at large and may be deemed a public nuisance because of excessive barking.
- Snow must be removed from any paved footway or sidewalk by owner or occupant of the property.
- Grass, weeds, etc. must be cut and/or controlled; failure to do so could result in a fine.
- No inoperative vehicle may be kept or displayed within the Town.

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TOWN OFFICE

The Broadway Municipal Building is located at 116 Broadway Avenue. The Town Office is located in this building and its business hours are Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. The mailing address is P.O. Box 156, Broadway, Virginia 22815. And for your convenience, a drop box is located at the rear of the Municipal Building to leave payments after hours.

TOWN MEETINGS

The Broadway Town Council meets on the first Tuesday of each month at 7:00 p.m. and the Broadway Planning Commission meets on the second Monday of each month at 7:00 p.m. All meetings are open to the public and are held in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building.

Residents of towns located within Rockingham County are assessed a Town tax in addition to Rockingham County real estate and personal property taxes. Town taxes are billed annually and are due December 5th each year. Tax payments may be made in person, mailed to the Town Office at P. O. Box 156, Broadway, VA 22815 or placed in the drop box at the rear of the Municipal Building.

Why do I pay taxes to both the County and Town?
Towns and counties provide different services. The majority of County tax money goes toward funding the school system. The County also provides fire and rescue services, the court system, landfill, dispatching services, health and welfare benefits, and many other services enjoyed by Town citizens. So you are not paying double taxes, you are just buying services from two separate providers.

The owner of any motor vehicle or trailer, who is a resident of Broadway or has a place of business in the Town that uses a motor vehicle, is assessed a vehicle license fee which appears on the annual personal property tax bill. Failure to pay your personal property tax will result in notification being provided to the Department of Motor Vehicles, which will prohibit you from obtaining vehicle license registration renewal.

GARBAGE COLLECTION & RECYCLING

Both garbage and recycling are picked-up on Monday of each week. If a holiday falls on Monday and the collection date is changed, notification will be published in the *Daily News-Record*. A \$24.50 fee is added to the water bill for trash & recycling collection. Garbage must be placed in a “toter” as provided by Waste Management. An extra toter is available at an additional cost of \$1.00 per month. A recycling bin is provided and should be left by the previous occupant; if a new bin is required contact the Town Office. Garbage and recycling should be placed adjacent to the street for pick-up no earlier than 4:00 p.m. the day before and no later than 7:00 a.m. the day of scheduled collection.

What should I do if my garbage is not picked-up?

Call the Town Office at (540) 896-5152 and the staff will notify Waste Management.

SPECIAL CLEAN-UPS

Four special bulk trash pick ups are held each year. They are held on the first Monday of October, January, April, and July. On these dates, any type of trash refuse that can be handled by one employee and does not exceed 8 ft. in length will be picked up. All trash must be out on the curb by 7:00 a.m. No tires, batteries, items containing Freon, liquids, yard waste or hazardous materials are accepted.

Special yard waste pick ups are held on the first Tuesday of each month. Yard waste includes brush, twigs, sticks, limbs and bagged leaves. Regulations are: Maximum 4’ long, 2” in diameter, bundled and tied, not to exceed 75 lbs., 5 units max; 1 unit is trash can size bundle (not exceeding 75 lbs.)
